### February 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020, Pozzuoli

#### Welcome and Introduction

On Monday morning the headteacher of the host school and his staff welcomed the participants of the partner schools at Petronio. All the ceremony was videotaped by local journalists and by Petronio Magazine journalists. After that, Petronio school students showed to the guests all the Petronio labs and classrooms. During the welcome ceremony, the weekly program was presented and also the Kahoot/Socrative and Rubistar apps were presented and described by our students. All the students were asked to take notes or record the information given by the English guide throughout the planned tours, explaining them the importance of this step because, following these instructions, they would have had enough content to prepare the Kahoot/Socrative questionnaires. The didactic method applied was learning by doing and, moreover, the students had the chance to practice their written and spoken English. After lunch, taken at the school restaurant, the group moved by bus and got to Pozzuoli where they visited Rione Terra, the ancient quarter of Pozzuoli (abandoned in the 1980s due to bradyseism), located on a tufa spur at 33 metres above sea level, which dominates the port. Archaeological excavations are revealing the fascinating fabric of the Roman town, preserved intact in the subsoil, with roads lined with stores. This area was once







the glorious Acropolis of Puteoli, an invincible defence against enemies. Today we can see numerous Greco-Roman works .

#### February 18th, 2020, Pozzuoli

On Tuesday morning we met at school where we collected the lunch boxes and we left to Pompeii, the ancient city located in the modern comune of Pompei near Naples which represents one of the most significant proofs of Roman civilization and, like an open book, provides outstanding information on the art, customs, trades and everyday life of the past. It was unexpectedly buried in the thick layer of ash and lava which poured down from the devastating eruption of Vesuvius. It was the year 79 A.D. All the students and teachers showed great interest in asking to the guide many questions and the students were very involved in taking notes and in recording the information given by the guide. The same interest was displayed when we visited the most characteristic landscapes in Naples like via Caracciolo, via Posillipo. A lot of material was gathered!

#### February 19th, 2020, Pozzuoli

On Wednesday the whole group of the participants, students and teachers, was involved in workshop activities. The students were shared in two labs and were asked to prepare questions and answers about the previous visits already done. Students employed all the information achieved and started to create questionnaires using mainly Kahoot app. The method applied was the flipped classroom thanks to which students became the main actors of the entire learning approach. They enjoyed a lot without having any particular efforts and on the other hand, they practised their spoken and written English.

After lunch, taken at the school restaurant, the group moved by bus and got to Cantine Mirabilis where the teachers had a wine tasting of the famous Flegrei wines. Close to the winery the group visited the Piscine Mirabilis which is an ancient Roman cistern on the Bacoli hill. Even during this tour students took notes of the information given to them by the English guide in order to fill the following questionnaires.

#### February 20th, 2020, Pozzuoli







On the fourth day, the partners by bus, got to Naples city centre where they had the chance to visit the most significant and historical buildings, places and churches of the city like Piazza del Plebiscito, via Toledo, Galleria Umberto I, Piazza del Gesù e la Chiesa del Gesù, San Domenico Maggiore e San Gregorio Armeno, the street of Presepi. During the tour the whole group were followed by the English guide and so the students and the teachers had the opportunity to have further explanation and consequently other materials to use for their questionnaires. The didactic method applied, again, is learning by doing and finally they benefited from using English language so much.

#### February 21st, 2020, Pozzuoli

On the final day all the students discussed and presented their works in Aula Magna, previously prepared in Petronio school's labs. Everyone participated to the quizzes edited by the students. Their links are the followings:

At this ceremony we enjoyed the participation of Mrs Anna Attore, the City Council Member for Public Education of Pozzuoli, who handed in the Certificates.

Finally, we had a farewell lunch at school restaurant whose theme was The Carnival. This part of the mobility was entirely curated by our students; they had the idea and they provided for carnival decorations.
